My heart is full of gratitude as I survey the events of the past year and look ahead to exciting developments in the College in the year to come.

Our incoming class is a keen and devout lot (Chapel attendance is up), and the current Student Council is excellent. There are lots of extra-curricular activities and students are engaged in their classes and on social media. We are grateful for the stability of our enrolment. But knowing that it is getting harder to get people to come to Toronto for theological education, we are working to make our courses more accessible. When it comes to training people for church leadership, however, we are committed to a model of formation involving community learning and worship.

The spirit in the College is also positive. There are lots of good stories to tell, and our Development and Communications offices have been doing a great job of getting the Wycliffe name in front of new constituencies through our web site and social media outlets. Part of what attracts people to Wycliffe are also the special events we hold here, such as preaching day with Fleming Rutledge, a debate this fall between a prominent atheist (Michael Shermer) and a well-known Christian theologian (Alister McGrath), a colloquium on the Reformation and mission and, of course, our annual Indigenous Leadership Week.

The year has kept my calendar full of a variety of meetings, speaking engagements and opportunities to explore partnerships.

Sadly, the year also held two occasions of deep sorrow for the College. The first was the death of former Principal Reg Stackhouse in December of last year. I don't believe that the College has had a more loyal supporter. I will miss his counsel and the ability to consult his extraordinary repository of all matters Wycliffe. The other is the recent death of Board Member Ken Macdonald. Ken was a giant of a man, who will be greatly missed.



Operating Revenue



Operating Expenditures



Who Gives to Wycliffe?




