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O the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus

grew up in the Mennonite Brethren (MB) church, an Anabaptist group that broke off from the Russian Mennonites in 1860, and like all Mennonites, we fit the stereotype that we make good singers, usually in singing in four-parts. The "priesthood of

all believers" naturally extends to the "choir of all believers."

The church I attended was "progressive" among the MB churches in Niagara (which isn't progressive by most standards). The worship band quickly took over from the choir during my childhood. However, hymnody didn't disappear—it was transformed. Band leaders set the music in ways so the congregation could, for the most part, still sing in four parts and songwriters wrote new melodies to less-sung hymns. Songwriting became such a strong part of my church's identity that we built a recording studio. Congregational singing flourished. As a child, this all seemed very normal.

I first heard the hymn "O the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus" set to a tune by Chris Fowler, a pastor and songwriter at my church. (You can hear the tune here: goo.gl/qDAxoE). The melody is warm and, to

my ears, sounds like it is "leading homeward." I have good memories of hearing my father singing the hymn while washing dishes or around the home, and I find myself singing it while riding my bike around the city.

The text, by Samuel Trevor Francis (1834–1925), describes Jesus' love as deep waters—an ocean—with a current that leads us to Himself.

It wasn't until many years later when I found out that "O the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus" is set to a dramatically different melody. The hymn is traditionally set to the Welsh hymn tune "Ebenezer" written by Thomas John Williams in 1896. Fun (alternative) fact: the tune is also known as "Tôn Y Botel" from lore that suggests the tune was found in a bottle that washed up on the Welsh shores. Outside of Wales, the tune is set to harmony by Vaughan Williams. It sounds powerful, muscular, and due to its minor key, a holy ominousness fills the room if all the stops are pulled out on the organ. The sounds of a "mighty ocean" thunderously ring.

Fowler's and Williams' settings both reveal the deep, deep love of Jesus in very different ways. If you're interested, you can ask me to sing either version for you if you see me around Wycliffe.

Remuneration is dependent on qualifications.


