There's a Voice in the Wilderness Crying

There's a voice in the wilderness crying, A call from the ways untrod: Prepare in the desert a highway, A highway for our God!



S a child I first loved "There's a Voice in the Wilderness Crying" for its joyful tune ("<u>Ascension</u>"), written by Hugh Bancroft, an organist in Hamilton. More recently though I've come to love this hymn for some other reasons.

First, I love it because it sings (and so teaches) scripture. Its three verses reflect almost word-for-word Isaiah 40: 3-11. In an age when so few people know Scripture it seems especially important that our hymns ground us in it. When the religious leaders asked John the Baptist just who he thought he was, he quoted from this passage. This is why this hymn is often sung in Advent, when we recall John's ministry. John was able to quote from Isaiah because he knew Isaiah's words. How important for the Church's worship to continue to be grounding people in Scripture. Second, I love it because it is deeply apostolic in content. The meaning of the word "apostle" is "one sent out with a message." Isaiah was sent with this message, John the Baptist was sent with this message, and the Church is sent with it today. The kingdom of God is already on the way! Get ready people! In an age when so few Christians seem to have either the will or the skill to share their faith, the message of this hymn to live out our apostolic calling remains as important as ever.

Third, I love it because it is steeped in a desire for Christian unity. This hymn was written by James Lewis Milligan (1876-1961), a journalist and poet who in 1911 immigrated to Canada from the UK, first serving as a Methodist lay pastor in Actinolite, north of Tweed. In 1913, he became the editor of the Peterborough Review, and in 1922 he was hired as head of public relations for church union. Within three years The Methodist Church, The Congregational Union of Canada, and a majority of the congregations of The Presbyterian Church of Canada had decided to unify. Milligan wrote this hymn in 1925 to celebrate the formation of the United Church of Canada. By the 1930s it was well-loved by Anglicans as well, and so became a musical tie-that-binds believers of many different backgrounds.
