"It is Well with My Soul"

Gearing "It is well, it is well, with my soul," sung slowly has the power to offer deep comfort to those facing adversity. This is one reason why this hymn is a favorite of mine. (If it isn't a favorite of yours, I ask

you to read on in the hope that it might become one.)

Its writer, Horatio Spafford, was certainly no stranger to adversity. A prominent lawyer in Chicago, Spafford lost a fortune in the Chicago fire of 1871. That same year he and his wife Anna lost a son to pneumonia. And just a few years later they lost *all four of their daughters*—Annie, Maggie, Bessie, and Tanetta—to a shipwreck at sea.

The story goes like this. In 1873 the Spafford family decided to take an ocean-liner to England, but Horatio stayed back at the last minute for a business matter. He promised to follow soon. However, at mid-sea *The Ville du Havre* collided with another ship and sunk, killing most of the passengers, including the Spafford girls. Anna survived and soon sent a telegram from Wales: "Saved alone. What shall I do?"

Spafford took the next available ship to visit

and comfort his wife. Four days out, the captain showed Mr. Spafford the approximate location where his daughters had drowned. Whether right then or not, it was on this journey that he wrote: "When peace like a river attendeth my soul, When sorrows like sea billows roll, Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, 'It is well, it is well, with my soul'."

The end of the story might be a bad spoiler for some (fair warning!), but takes little if anything away from the faith and courage these hymn lines reflect and evoke. Although the Spaffords moved to Jerusalem where they founded a care centre for all of Jerusalem's people, they soon drifted into wildly heretical ideas and practices, along with, in the case of Horatio, becoming delusional. Tragedy had befallen them again. Or perhaps it is better to say that tragedy caught up with them in the end.

Rather than spoil anyone's love for this hymn, I hope that I might have brought comfort and hope to another group of people—those who cannot sing "It is well with my soul," in the midst of tragedy! After all, God knows we Christians are only human. Besides, whatever is well with our souls owes nothing to human fortitude and everything to God. Horatio died in 1888 and was buried in Jerusalem.




