"Gregory the Great"

regory the Great (c. 540-604) was born into an aristocratic family and assumed an important municipal office before yielding to a call to the monastic life in his early 30s. Cashing in his considerable real estate holdings, he founded seven monasteries

and gave the rest of his wealth to the poor. He developed missionary ambitions when he encountered Anglo-Saxon youths being sold in a Roman slave market, and he resolved to travel to Britain with the gospel. But then the pope died and Gregory was, reluctantly, elected to the post.

His tenure as pope was marked by the prudent and skillful management of a variety of challenging civil and church issues. But he eschewed pomposity and authoritarianism. Rather, he adopted the humble title, *servus servorum Dei*, the 'servant of the servants of God'.

His connections with us today remain strong.

To begin with, the English Church, to which this college traces its roots, was largely established by a mission to Britain under the direction of Augustine, whom Gregory dispatched to Canterbury in 596.

Gregory understood the importance of gospel contextualisation when he instructed Augustine not


to destroy the pagan temples, but only the idols in them, and gave him permission to refashion cultural festivals for Christian purposes. If he were a student today, I am certain that Gregory would be in the MDiv Pioneer stream.

However, there is another reason why Gregory the Great is a notable figure for us today. It is because of his insight into the pastoral calling and what is required for leadership in Christ's Church. His work *Pastoral Care* describes the responsibilities clergy face and how a healthy inner life can sustain us in our vocations. Mindful of the fact that there are some in our Wycliffe community who are struggling with the nature of God's call, let us conclude with what Gregory says about those who desire to be leaders compared to those who feel compelled to be leaders.

Gregory cites as our biblical guide the two examples of Isaiah and Jeremiah. In the case of Isaiah, when the Lord asks, 'Whom shall I send?' the prophet replies: 'Here am I! Send me!' (6.8). By contrast, Jeremiah shrinks from the divine call: 'Ah! Lord God, I am not skilled in speaking; I am too young!' (1.6). Both reactions, in Gregory's view, were laudable. And they were both acceptable to God. For Isaiah's eagerness was conditioned by the cleansing coal, while Jeremiah's reluctance was overcome by the gifts of grace. Cleansing and grace, humility and obedience, may these be the instruments of God's work in our lives as we seek to respond faithfully to his call.


