Katharina Schütz Zell (1497-1562) - Glen Taylor

Katharina Schütz Zell was a feisty, devout, and

outspoken Protestant Reformer. Historians typically refer to her as the most prolific and interesting of female Reformers.



Well known to Luther and Calvin, as well as to Bucer, Melanchton, Schwenkfeld and Zwingli, it is a shame that she is not better known to us.

Katharina Schütz Zell was born in late 1497 or early 1498 into the home of well-regarded citizens of Strasbourg. In 1523 she married the city's first Protestant minister, Matthew Zell, which marriage, new for clergy, led to her

excommunication. Not

one to ignore a controversy, Schütz Zell wrote in defense of clergy marrying by noting some celibate clergy who were responsible for

seven women being pregnant at the same time. Other outspoken writings include a scathing defense of her husband's integrity in light of false accusations that Ludwig Rabus, a former "ministerial assistant" to Matthew Zell, had made against him. (Ironically, "assistant minister," was a title that both Matthew and Schütz Zell kept exclusively for her in light of the pastoral ministry she offered

both alongside and, with his knowledge and consent, independently of Rev. Matthew Zell.) On another occasion she wrote the town council about the state of the hospital, stating: "The manager and his wife lie in luxury and neglect the patients. Beds rot . . . tough and sometimes wormy meat is served There is no religious instruction and some patients do not know the Lord's Prayer. The manager mumbles a grace so that one cannot tell whether he may be swearing Get rid of the savage dog which mangles all the cats" (cited from Bainton, Women, p. 71).

Schütz Zell was no less apt to back down from a controversy than she was pastorally to

console the afflicted. For example, she wrote a letter consoling the several women who had been shut out of a neighboring city on account of their Protestant faith. Or, again for example, she wrote a long and profoundly pastoral letter to Sir Felix Armbruster in which she sought through her reflections on Psalm 51 and the Lord's Prayer "to be present for your comfort and in part to help bear your cross spiritually if not physically—or to lighten it with as much spiritual comfort as God has given to me "

Schütz Zell's work deserves even more attention than has skillfully been given it already by scholars Roland Bainton, Elsie Mckee, Charlotte Methuen, Stjerna Kirsi, and others. (For example, Rachel Ball here at Wycliffe has translated Schütz Zell's treatise on Christ in the Psalms.) I conclude with a final quote from Schütz Zell:

"You remind me that the Apostle Paul told women to be silent in church. I would remind you of the word of this same apostle that in Christ there is no longer male nor female and of the prophecy of Joel: 'I will pour forth my spirit upon all flesh and

your sons and your daughters will prophesy.' I do not pretend to be John the Baptist rebuking the Pharisees. I do not claim to be Nathan upbraiding David. I aspire only to be Balaam's ass, castigating his master." (Bainton, Women, p. 55.)

In light of this it is hardly a wonder that Schütz Zell gave what might aptly be called a sermon at her husband's funeral, following on the heels of one by Martin Bucer at the funeral proper, by offering a "meditation" at her beloved husband's graveside.

Escape the danger! As you write your papers, remember these do's and don'ts:

Do track down your sources.

Do state the source explicitly in your paper.

Do use quotation marks if you borrow the exact words.

⇒ As one atheist said, "God is dead. God remains dead. And we have killed him" (Nietzsche, Gay Science, 125).

Nietzsche said that God is dead. God remains dead. And we have killed him (*Gay Science*, 125). **Problem: No quotations marks!**

Don't use the exact words without quotation marks.

Don't paraphrase without stating a source.

It's possible that God is dead, he's staying dead, and we're the ones who bumped him off. **Problem:** No attribution!


